A recount by Caleb L of 3/4M

On Wednesday I went to Narara Valley High School for the Science Fair. We made ice-cream, friends and slime. We also did experiments and we had a great day. We started by getting on a mini bus to the High School and then we got split into groups and I started off at the oxygen and gas station. Then we went to a fire extinguisher station where we experimented with different gases to see which one puts out a fire. It turned out that bi-carb and another powder puts out fire. Then we went to test axis and gravity. We made ice-cream and got to eat it. Then we tested different battery materials to see which worked. Then we went to the physical science area and made slime and all this cool stuff. Then we had a sausage sizzle. We then tested how bubbles are created and also tested gas and carbon dioxide before going home.



SCIENCE WEE

Last week, Stage One engaged in a variety of science experiments. The students had a lot of fun learning about the different effects of pushing and pulling, changes in the weather, different properties of materials and recyclable and non-recyclable materials. All of the science experiments conducted were related to the unit of work about 'Staying Alive' that Stage One have been learning about this term.

2M and 2AKG have been growing coriander, parsley and snow peas in their vegetable patch. Last Friday, they collected the coriander and made Thai Beef Salad.
