School Attendance

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

School Hours and Supervision

Parents and caregivers are reminded that school starts at 8.55 am and finishes at 2.50 pm. Supervision begins at 8.25 am and no students should be at school before this time. All children who are late need to be signed in at the office and are marked as a partial absence. If you need to take your child early for an appointment from school, you will need to sign them out from the office.

Grandparents Day

Please collect your child promptly in the afternoon. If you know you are going to be late, then please make alternative arrangements either with a friend or neighbour or After School Care.

Absent From School

It is a legal requirement that all absences be explained by parents within seven days of the first day of absence, either by phone or note. An unexplained absence will result in a note being sent home asking you to explain the absence. With absences that are less than a week, please send in a note upon your child's return to school. For longer absences, please make an initial phone call to school to explain the reason for the absence, then follow up with a written note upon your child's return to school. If you are intending on taking extended leave, please ask for an extended leave application form from the office.

Arrival Time

Arriving at school and class on time is very important as it:

- ensures students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day;
- helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine;
- gives students time to greet their friends before class; and
- reduces classroom disruption.

Lateness is recorded as a partial attendance and needs to be explained by parents.

NAPLAN Test Dates

Test dates for all students in Years 3 and 5 are the 10th, 11th and 12th May. The 13th May is a catch up date for students who were away on the day of testing. Please avoid making appointments for students on these dates as the information gained from the testing program is very important for both parents and the school.
