School Planning 2025

Is your family returning to Ourimbah PS in 2025? If you are moving out of the area or intend enrolling your children at another school in 2025, please let the <u>front</u> office know in writing as soon as possible.

The **School Leadership Team** and I are beginning our preparations for the new school year and we require accurate enrolment figures to determine how our school is staffed and the likely class structures for next year.

If you are aware of any students moving into our area who will be attending our school in 2025 please ask the families to make contact with the school and commence the enrolment process. If you have any concerns pertaining to your child's class placement next year, please take the time to talk <u>to your</u> child's class teacher early in Term 4 and jot your concerns down in writing so we can ensure we are addressing any parental affairs when classes are being drafted.

Any parental requests in relation to class placements for the following school year **must be made annually** to avoid disappointment once classes have been finalised at the beginning of the new school year!

The executive staff and I are happy for parents to outline aspects of their child's learning and development that **may need special consideration** when forming class compositions for the following year, which may impact upon their academic, social or emotional wellbeing. However, **please do not request specific teachers** as we do not take these sorts of requests into consideration when composing class lists.

Student Wellbeing and Health Care

We welcome information from parents about your **child's health**, even if you are not requesting specific support from our school. Our school asks for **medical information** when you enrol your child. It is also important that you let us know if your child's health care needs change or if a new health condition develops.

Information about **allergies**, **medical conditions** such as **asthma**, **anaphylaxis**, **diabetes** and other health care related issues (including prior conditions such as medical procedures in the last 12 months) should be provided to the school by parents. Please provide this information **in writing to the principal**. This will greatly assist our school in planning to support your child's individual health and wellbeing.

Please also remember to notify staff in the school office of any changes to your **contact details** or to the contact details of other people nominated as **emergency contacts**.

We appreciate your assistance in this regard and assure you that any information you provide the school will be stored securely and will only be used or disclosed in order to support your son or daughter's health needs or as otherwise required by law.

When a medical practitioner has **prescribed medication** that **<u>must be</u>** administered during the school day, parents are responsible to request the school's support **in writing**. Students **must not carry medications** unless there is a **written agreement** between the school and the student's parents that this is a planned part of the **student's individual health care support**. Please consider the following points when communicating with our school about your child's health care needs:

✓ liaise with the child's medical practitioner about the implications of the child's health condition for their schooling.

- ✓ where medication is prescribed, ask the medical practitioner whether the medication is available in a form which **minimises or eliminates** the need to provide the medication during the school day.
- convey all relevant advice and information from the medical practitioner to the school.
- ✓ provide prescribed medication and 'consumables' for administration by the school in a timely way and as agreed with the principal and described in your child's Individual Health Care Plan.
- ✓ collaborate with the school in planning to support the child's health needs at school including updating information and reviewing plans.

Please contact the **front office (4362 1033)** should you require a note requesting the school's support for your child's personal health care needs. Those parents who have already provided the school with this relevant information need only inform the school if your **child's health care needs have changed**.

Staff Development Day - Thursday 19 / Friday 20 December

School development days (SDD) are used by schools to build on the knowledge and skills of our teachers, school leaders and school administrative support staff through a targeted professional learning program.

Professional learning is important in building the capabilities of all staff to ensure a highly skilled and professional workforce that can support the department's vision for NSW public education to be Australia's best education system and one of the finest in the world. School development days improve the learning outcomes of students by:

- providing targeted professional learning activities aligned to school strategic directions and Department of Education priorities
- enabling whole school planning and enhancing teacher quality, school leadership and management practices
- implementing legislative and policy requirements.

Please be aware that the last two days of the 2024 school year are designated SDD – Thursday 19 and Friday 20 December. School finishes for all students on Wednesday 18 December 2024.

Bushfire Response Plan – Category 1

Please be advised of the school's bushfire emergency arrangements for the upcoming bushfire season. Our school is in a bushfire prone area and is listed as Category 1 on the NSW Department of Education's bushfire risk register. To ensure the health, safety and welfare of students and staff, the department has determined that on days when NSW Rural Fire Service declares a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating for Greater Sydney Region, our school will temporarily cease operations for the following day.

In addition, schools may be made non-operational due to changing higher risk conditions and advice from emergency services and the State Emergency Operations Centre.

We recommend that you download the <u>NSW Education</u> <u>Parent App</u> and select to monitor advice from our school which will push notifications to you advising that the school is non-operational. We also recommend that you stay up to date with bushfire and grassfire activity by using the <u>Hazards Near Me app</u> (set a watch zone for your school area), and by monitoring local media. You can also review fire activity and alert levels on the <u>RFS</u> <u>website</u>.

A flyer outlining information for parents and carers about arrangements for the bushfire danger period has been included with this week's newsletter.

Selective High School - 2024

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability and by using specialised teaching methods.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and no longer takes into account school assessment scores. The **Selective High School Placement Test** will be held on **Thursday 4 May 2023**.

Applications for Year 7 entry to selective high schools in 2024 will be accepted from Tuesday 18 October 2022 to Wednesday 16 November 2022. You must apply before the closing date as no late applications will be considered. Please note, there are no paper application forms.

Further information, including a link to the online registration site, will be distributed once it has been received by the school.


We're excited to announce that we raised just under \$2,500, which will go towards purchasing new books from

Even if your plan is to leave early, the more you prepare your home, the more likely it will survive a bush fire or ember attack.

- A well prepared home can also:
- Be easier for you or firefighters to defend
- Be less likely to put your neighbours' homes at risk
- > Give you more protection if a fire threatens suddenly and you cannot leave

There are simple things you can do around your home to prepare it for a bush fire. Some are regular actions, like mowing the lawn, others are one-off, but all could help save you, your family and your home.

School Band Program

Dear Parents,

Today your child attended a demonstration showcasing the instruments available to learn at school in 2025. If you would like more information please register your interest using the link or QR code below within the next 5 days.

Once you have registered your child's interest TSA will then conduct instrument trials at school to help your child discover which instrument they are most suited to. Following the instrument trials, an *Enrolment Pack* will be sent home with your child. This will contain more detailed information about the school band program along with the result of their instrument trial.

Band Program Structure

Rehearsal (all students work together in a full band setting)

· Once a week, generally before or after school, for 30-60 minutes

Tuition (students work in small groups or individually to learn new skills)

30min per week, at school, usually on the same day as rehearsal

Students attend both rehearsal and tuition at school. Regular practise at home (3-4 times a week) is essential.

Band Program Costs

Tuition Fees: small group tuition and band rehearsal costs \$230 (plus \$10 resource levy) per term. Individual tuition costs extra and is not available at all schools.

Instrument: students require their own instrument. TSA sells quality new instruments, offers 'rent-to-buy' (starting at \$43 per month) and has an excellent selection of second hand instruments in near-new condition.

Accessories: students are provided with a workbook upon enrolment but may require other accessories, generally less than \$50 per year.
