We are very excited that Kindergarten have already started 'big school' a little earlier this year and we look forward to being able to take them on their educational journey. I thank the **Kindergarten Team Mrs Wakelin**, **Mrs Brown**, **Mrs Anderson**, **Miss Nebauer**, **Miss Gordge** and **Mrs Adams** for the wonderful Kinder Transition program they have provided to ensure a positive start for our youngest students.

Class Placements

Last week, the students and staff were placed in their new classes for 2025. The staff and I have spent a significant amount of time in placing students in particular classes and have done so with great consideration, thought and sensitivity. Issues such as academic progress, social relationships and student behaviour and wellbeing were, and continue to be, all contributing factors when making decisions about class placements. We are confident this is the best make-up for our school organisation and base this foundation upon a collaborative, diverse and professional approach during the planning phase.

A number of parent requests were submitted at the end of 2024, and we have made every effort to accommodate these needs. Whilst we welcome parental input into their child's ongoing education, including requests from parents highlighting exceptional circumstances that need to be considered when placing children into a new class, I must emphasise that, as professionals, the teachers and I are in the best position to determine final class placements for students.

This year, we have had several changes in student enrolments and staffing allocations to consider when forming classes - our current student cohort is **341 students**. This has meant that, according to NSW Departmental Policy and school staffing protocols, we are able to establish **14 classes** for 2025. The school is staffed on total student enrolments (K-6) and not on the number of students in each grade. This means that some composite classes are inevitable in a school our size.

Composite/Multi-age Classes

Composite classes are a regular inclusion in all Australian schools. This year, we have 10 composite classes, which are influenced by student numbers, wellbeing considerations and the academic and social needs of our students. Our staff take great care in ensuring that every student is placed in a classroom that

best meets his/her personal needs. Factors such as learning and social benefits are of prime importance.

Inclusion in composite classes can be a very positive experience for students. The students, whilst participating in regular grade appropriate programs, will have the opportunity to work with their peers to improve their learning performance. They will also develop their independence skills and enhance their interpersonal abilities.

No class should ever be viewed as a "single-year class" due the wide disparity in age, physical development, cognitive development and social development that naturally occurs in each grade level. Even in Kindergarten each year there is often an 18-month age difference between the oldest and youngest students due to the NSW Department of Education enrolment policy.

As in all other classes, all students will be provided with learning programs relevant to their own individualised needs, abilities and interests. Students in composite classes will regularly integrate with other students in their grade for a wide variety of activities – including sport, fitness, excursions and planned academic programs.

Various studies into class structures have concluded that there is no difference in the academic performance of students attributed to single year vs composite class structures. Research does show far more important factors that influence student performance include the quality of teaching, teacher/student relationships and the social and emotional wellbeing of students.

School Bytes

School Bytes is a comprehensive school management platform providing Ourimbah PS with the tools we need to operate smoothly & efficiently. Over the holiday break we have transitioned over to some new modules for 2025.

The parent communication module allows our school to send personalised emails and SMS correspondence to each family. Parents will be able to access real time data about school events: your child's attendance, academic reports, excursion information and payments and wellbeing data keeping families informed about student behaviour and progress at school.


School Bytes - information for parents

- 3. Enter the school's name in the field that says 'enter a school name'
- 4. Select the school's name and the timetable should open on your device.
- 5. If you are unable to find or search for the school's name, use the drop-down menus on the same web page to find the school.
- 6. Once the timetable is opened, you will be able to identify which school bus services are available in your area for your child to use.
