#### Student Behaviour Management - new policy

Throughout 2024, the NSW Department of Education released a new Student Behaviour Policy, including an updated *Behaviour Code for Students* (attached to this newsletter), *Detention and time-out procedures* as well as revised *Suspension and Expulsion procedures*.

These updates provided public schools with direction and guidance on supporting and managing safe, responsible and respectful student behaviour in NSW public schools.

As stated in this new policy, student behaviour includes behaviour that occurs:

- at school
- on the way to and from school
- on school endorsed activities that are off-site (e.g. excursions)
- outside school hours and off school premises where there is a clear and close connection between the school and students' conduct (e.g. overnight camps)
- when using social media, mobile devices and/or other technology involving another student or staff member, where there is a clear and close connection between the school and students' conduct.

The school leadership team, in collaboration with staff, parents and students used the information and feedback collected through annual satisfaction surveys to review our current *School Behaviour Support and Management Plan (SBSMP)* and have now uploaded this plan to the OPS website. This plan is constantly being reviewed as we continue to fine-tune those programs and procedures that best support the behaviour and wellbeing of our students. #### Stages of Learning and Class Supervision

I wanted to take this opportunity to clarify a few details relating to class compositions and stage supervision for 2025. Classes are organised upon student enrolment numbers, and they may comprise of straight years or can be composite classes. Composite classes or multi-age classes are a regular inclusion in all Australian schools.

We take great care in ensuring that every student is placed in a classroom that best meets his/her needs. Factors such as learning and social benefits are of prime importance.

Schooling in NSW is organised into **seven stages of learning** across primary and secondary schools. Students move through stages of learning from Early Stage 1 (Kindergarten) to Stage 6 (Year 12).

The <u>NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA)</u> is responsible for the curriculum, Kindergarten to Year 12, for all NSW schools.

For the primary years, NESA develops syllabuses for all subjects in six key learning areas:

- English
- Mathematics
- Creative Arts
- Human Society and Its Environment (HSIE)
- Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE), and
- Science and Technology.

Primary School from Kindergarten to Year 6 (K-6) encompasses four stages of learning.

- Early Stage = Kindergarten (starting from five years of age)
- Stage 1 = Years 1 and 2
- Stage 2 = Years 3 and 4
- Stage 3 = Years 5 and 6

At Ourimbah PS, special groupings also occur across the school to promote students' academic and social learning. These include High Potential and Gifted Education (HPGE), Learning and Support (LST), sporting, creative and practical arts and Student Leadership (SRC) groups.

We have a highly productive learning support team that analyses all student performance data, then provides advice to staff and support for students in the form of small group learning sessions and individualised assistance with School Learning Support Officers (SLSOs).

If ever you have a particular concern regarding your child's education, **the first port of call is your child's class teacher**. If required, any concerns regarding students in a particular class can be referred to the relevant Stage / Class Supervisors. This year, we have some cross-stage classes which are supervised by the very committed and supportive Assistant Principals:

- Mrs Wakelin: KBN, K/1GW and K/1A
- Mrs Golding: 1M, 1/2BY, 2R and 2B
- Mrs Sutter: 3/4PN, 3/4T, 3/4S and 4/5EB
- Mrs Alamango: 5/6W, 5/6EK and 5/6A

#### NAPLAN Tests (Years 3 and 5)

NAPLAN is a national literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake. As students progress through their school years, it's important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy. NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national standards and over time.

Special provisions are provided to students with disability, or who require learning adjustments as part of their regular learning program, to enable an equivalent learner experience during NAPLAN testing and to encourage maximum participation.

A parent information flyer has been included with this week's newsletter which contains more detailed information. If you have a child in Year 3 or 5 this year and would like to know more about the NAPLAN testing, please contact the front office and ask to speak with your child's class teacher.

#### VOLUNTARY SCHOOL CONTRIBUTION

Each year we ask families to support their child/children by donating **\$50.00 per child (\$125 for a family of 3 or more children)** to the school as a **school voluntary contribution**. The money generated through the Voluntary School Contributions initiative is used to purchase much needed classroom resources and sports equipment for each class to utilise on a daily basis. #### NITBUSTERS VOLUNTEERS NEEDED MONDAY, 31<sup>ST</sup> MARCH

This school runs a Nitbusters Program on one day of each term, under the guidelines and health controls of the NSW Health Department.

Each class has an allotted time to come to the playground to be checked by a team of volunteer parents. The volunteer can quickly assess whether the child has contracted lice or may still have some concerning eggs. In either case, a letter is sent by mail to your home address indicating the outcome and suggested methods of eradication.

The program has been very successful in reducing outbreaks through the school by educating families to keep a regular weekly watch for lice and in breaking down the barriers of a taboo subject by freely discussing the issue.

This term, the Nitbusters Program will be held on Monday, 31<sup>st</sup> March from 9am. Melinda Cooper is the Nitbusters Coordinator and if you would like to help by volunteering ½ an hour to an hour of your time on Monday 31<sup>st</sup> March, please contact the office and leave your details for Melinda. All help is greatly appreciated.

## NAPLAN 2025

Information for parents and carers



#### Why do students do NAPLAN?

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake.

As students progress through their school years, it is important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy.

NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national proficiency standards.

NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with more information about students' educational progress.

NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working, and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

#### Your child will do the NAPLAN tests online

Online NAPLAN tests are designed to provide precise results and are engaging for students. The tests are tailored (or adaptive), which means that each test presents questions that may be more or less difficult depending on a student's responses. This helps students remain engaged with the assessment.

Tailored testing allows a wider range of student abilities to be assessed and measures student achievement more precisely. A student's overall NAPLAN result is based on both the number and complexity of questions they answer correctly. Your child should not be concerned if they find questions challenging; they may be taking a more complex test pathway.

All Year 3 students will continue to complete the writing assessment on paper.

#### What does NAPLAN assess?

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum.

Students sit assessments in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The questions assess content linked to the Australian Curriculum: English and Mathematics.

All government and non-government education authorities contribute to the development of NAPLAN test materials.

#### Participation in NAPLAN

NAPLAN is for all Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students. ACARA supports inclusive testing, so all students have the opportunity to participate in the National Assessment Program.

Information on adjustments available for students with disability who have diverse functional abilities and needs is provided in the **National protocols for test administration**.

Schools should work with parents/carers and students to identify, on a case-by-case basis, reasonable adjustments required for individual students with disability to access NAPLAN.

To help inform these decisions, you may consult the National protocols for test administration (linked above), NAPLAN public demonstration site, the Guide for schools to assist students with disability to access NAPLAN, and our series of videos where parents/carers, teachers and students share their experiences in using NAPLAN adjustments.

In exceptional circumstances, a student with a disability that severely limits their capacity to participate in the assessment, or a student who has recently arrived in Australia and has a non-English speaking background, may be granted a formal exemption.

Your school principal and your local test administration authority can give you more information on adjustments for students with disability or the process required to gain a formal exemption.



#### What if my child is absent from school on NAPLAN test days?

Where possible, schools may arrange for individual students who are absent at the time of testing to complete missed tests at another time during the school's test schedule.

#### What can I do to support my child?

Students are not expected to study for NAPLAN. You can support your child by letting them know that NAPLAN is a part of their school program and reminding them to simply do their best. Some explanation of NAPLAN is useful to help students understand and be comfortable with the format of the tests; however, it is not necessary for parents/carers to do this. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance.

ACARA does not recommend excessive preparation for NAPLAN or the use of services by coaching providers.

## How is my child's performance reported?

From 2023, NAPLAN results are reported against proficiency standards. There is a standard for each assessment area at each year level. Proficiency standards provide clear information on student achievement. They are set at a challenging but reasonable level expected of the child at the time of NAPLAN testing, based mainly on what has been taught in previous years of schooling. Student achievement is shown against 4 levels of proficiency: Exceeding, Strong, Developing and Needs additional support.

A NAPLAN individual student report will be provided by your child's school later in the year. If you do not receive a report, you should contact your child's school.

#### How are NAPLAN results used?

- Students and parents/carers use individual results to discuss progress with teachers.
- Teachers use results to help identify students who need greater challenges or extra support.
- Schools use results to identify strengths and areas of need to improve teaching programs, and to set goals in literacy and numeracy.
- School systems use results to review the effectiveness of programs and support offered to schools.
- The community can see information about the performance of schools over time at <u>myschool.edu.au</u>.

#### NAPLAN timetable

The NAPLAN test window is 9 days. This is to accommodate schools that may not have the capacity to complete the tests in a shorter time frame. The NAPLAN test window starts on Wednesday 12 March 2025 and finishes on Monday 24 March 2025. Schools will schedule the tests as soon as possible within the testing window, prioritising the first week.

### Behaviour code for students

#### Information for students and parents or carers

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive, and responsive learning environments for everyone across a range of settings. We teach and model the inclusive and safe behaviours we value in our students.

In NSW public schools students are expected, to the best of their ability, to:

- show respect to other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
- follow school and class rules and follow the directions of their teachers
- strive for the highest standards in learning
- act in a courteous and respectful way that makes all members of the school community feel valued, included and supported
- resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly
- meet the school's agreed uniform policy or dress code
- attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- respect all property
- be safe and not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol, vapes, e-cigarettes or tobacco into our schools
- not bully, harass, intimidate, or discriminate against anyone in our schools.

Schools take action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high-quality teaching and learning.

All students have a right to:

- safety at school
- access and fully participate in their learning
- be treated with respect by other students, teachers and school staff
- express their views, set goals and selfadvocate.

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments and apply an appropriate action when students are not meeting these expectations. The department is responsible for the provision of a policy framework and resources such as legal issues bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context, the NSW Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.

#### Behaviour code for students: Student actions

Promoting the inclusion, learning, wellbeing, and safety of all students in NSW public schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches across a range of settings to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

To meet the expectations set out above, students in NSW public schools, to the best of their ability, should adhere to the following principles.

#### Respect

- Treat one another with dignity.
- Communicate and behave courteously.
- Act and work cooperatively with other students, teachers, and school staff.
- Develop positive and respectful relationships.
- Value the interests, ability and culture of others.
- Respect the learning needs of other students.
- Dress appropriately by wearing the agreed school uniform or dress code.
- Take care with school property and the property of staff and other students.

#### Safety

- Model and follow school and class rules and expectations around behaviour and conduct.
- Negotiate and resolve conflict.
- Be aware of and take responsibility for how their behaviour and actions impact others.
- Care for self and others.
- Be safe and help others to make safe choices that do not hurt themselves or others.

#### Engagement



## **Traffic and Parking around your School**

Parking rules are designed to stop vehicles from parking where it would be dangerous or inconvenient for others. Please consider the residents when parking in streets surrounding your school.

- A School Zone is the area around a school with a speed limit of 40 km/h. Between the School Zone and End School Zone signs you must obey the school zone speed limit. The school zone speed limit only applies on gazetted school days and during the times shown on the sign.
- SCHOOL ZONE 8-9<sup>30</sup> 2<sup>30</sup>-4<sub>PM</sub> SCHOOL DAYS
- School Bus lights buses use signs and orange flashing 'wigwag' lights to warn motorists and pedestrians that they are picking up or setting down school children. The lights begin to flash when the bus stops and the doors are opened. They keep flashing for about 30 seconds after the doors close and continue even after the bus moves off. You must not drive past the bus in the same direction at more than 40 km/h while the 'wigwag' lights are flashing as there may be children crossing or about to cross the road.



A No Parking Zone means that you must not stop for more than two minutes. You must remain in or within three metres of the vehicle. No Parking Zones are suitable for dropping off and picking up.



#### THESE SIGNS MEAN YOU MAY STOP HERE TO DROP OFF / PICK UP BUT YOU MUST

- stop for up to 2 minutes only
- stay within 3 metres of vehicle
- Kids look to you to keep them safe please park legally in school zones HEAVY FINES and DEMERIT POINTS APPLY
- A Bus Zone means that the area is restricted for bus use only. If hours of operation are shown, the restriction only applies to this time. You may use this area outside of these times.



A No Stopping Zone means no stopping at any time.



### Kindergarten and new families orientation

Aim: To prevent the issues of illegal parking and misunderstanding by supplying information to new families about parking and safe access to the school.

#### Method

- Produce a map of the school area including unrestricted parking, no stopping area, bus zones, school crossings, good walking routes etc.
- Explain the Drop Off/Pick Up zone initiative highlighted in this guide.
- Include a slide in the presentation about other initiatives that the school has adopted to improve access and safety, and reduce congestion.

- Central Coast Council supplies separate 'Kindergarten Orientation' road safety information to schools. You may wish to use both documents in your presentation at kindy parent information days.
- Suggest parents get to know one another and meet for coffee when they return from walking together.
- Use a Frequent Walker Card.

#### Drop Off/Pick Up zone initiative

#### Aim: To reduce congestion, increase traffic flow and increase student safety.

The Drop Off/Pick Up zone is located at the No Parking area. Teachers, parents and other volunteers can assist children in and out of cars to reduce the amount of time cars are stopped in the No Parking zone. This initiative will allow more vehicles to move through the area.

The governing road rule for No Parking zones states:

Vehicle operators must not leave the vehicle by more than three metres and can only stay in the Drop Off/Pick Up zone for a maximum of two minutes. They cannot sit and wait for their child to come out of school, but must move on and come back when space is available again and their child is ready to enter the vehicle.

This zone is designed to allow as many parents/caregivers as possible to transport their child to and from school at the area close to the school gate. It is not for leaving vehicles parked. It allows parents/caregivers to let their child out of the vehicle near the school in the morning. In the afternoon, children wait in a designated area until their parents/caregivers arrives to collect them.

An easy way to remember how this works is the '1,2,3' concept - 1 car, for 2 minutes, remaining within 3 metres of the vehicle.

#### Variations and tips

 Staggered set down/pick up times to help reduce congestion further. For example, some parents would come five minutes after the bell, some ten minutes and so forth. Parents/caregivers would nominate their pick up time.

Central Coast Council's Road Safety Education program has supplied the above corflute signage for display near the No Parking zone to identify it as the Drop Off/Pick Up zone. If your school's signage is damaged or you require more signs, please contact your Council Road Safety Officer.

#### Organised parent/volunteer pickup system

An organised system may not be needed for the morning drop off when families arrive over a staggered period. It may work very effectively, however, to help with the afternoon traffic flow when all students depart the school at the one time.

## Road Safety – a Shared Responsibility

When thinking about road safety, what is *shared responsibility*? It's a way for us, individually, to ensure the safety of everyone in our community.

Central Coast Council regularly reviews the environment around our many schools, improving areas such as the setup of parking restrictions or the upgrading of crossings. Supporting schools to educate their school community about road safety outside schools is also a role of our Council.

Everyone in the school community - parents, grandparents, carers, teachers, students, bus drivers, crossing supervisors and motorists passing through the area – all have a responsibility for the road safety of our children.

Please consider the following to help keep the members of your school community safe

- If you drop off or pick up children to or from school, please follow the Road Rules
- There are designated areas that allow for parking but there are also areas that do not allow parking
- · Pedestrian and / or School Crossings provide the safest options for crossing the road
- Speed limits are set at 40km/hour to help keep people around school areas

   especially children safe.

Road safety around schools is about *shared responsibility*. Addressing road safety issues are not always about needing more parking spaces.

## Children are great imitators so please set a good example and model safe behaviour.

The Safe System Approach to Road Safety has been adopted in NSW. The following is taken from the NSW Towards Zero Road Safety Campaign:

People are at the heart of the safe system approach to road safety.

Road safety is a shared responsibility – everyone needs to make safe decisions on and around the road to prioritise safety.

All road users owe it to themselves and to everyone else on the road to follow the road rules and drive to the conditions. Crashes can be prevented, and lives can be saved, by making safe choices.
